

English

Narrative – Our narrative work this half term is all based around Legends. With the end result of writing our own legend.

Non fiction – We will be growing our understanding of report writing, the features included in a non-chronological report and constructing our own report gathering information for a variety of sources.

Poetry – Our poetry this term is all to do with riddles and the structure of them, allowing us to read and write our own riddle. At the same time we will continue to develop our vocabulary in poems.

DT

Linking to our History topic of The Romans, we will be making our own Roman drawstring purses. Understanding the research and design process that needs to go into making a new product.

Art

Our topic for Art is 'Fruit and Veg' focusing on our understanding of colour. We will be starting off with observational drawings focusing on colour and leading onto a textiles-based piece of work.

History

Our topic in History this term is The Romans. Looking at their invasion into Britain and the impact this had on life in Britain. As well as looking at different aspects of the Romanisation of Britain.

Physical Education

Basketball – we will develop further our understanding of dribbling, passing and shooting techniques. We will be introduced to marking through mini game situations

Tennis – movement on the court will be developed through an understanding of 'thinking one shot ahead'. We will experience forehand and backhand shots.

Gymnastics – we will improve posture and flow, and refine basic gymnastic shapes. As well as beginning to form sequences of travelling and balancing.

Maths

Carrying on with fractions from last term we will further develop and look at adding and subtracting them. We will then move onto comparing and classifying shapes according to their properties.

We will progress from mental addition and subtraction to formal written methods and we will also begin to look at statistics, understanding different graphs and solving problems using information from a graph.

Science

Starting with forces and magnets, we will compare how different objects move on different surfaces. We will then move on to looking at electricity and construct a series of simple electrical circuits. Throughout the term we will continue to develop our knowledge and understanding of working scientifically.

Geography

In our Extreme Earth topic we will learn about the destructive powers of nature from volcanoes and earthquakes to tsunamis and tornadoes. We will begin to develop our understanding as to why these events take place.

Computing

As well as continuing learning around e-safety, we will be looking at programming games.

French – Au Café


We will revise learning from our core topic of 'saying the date'. We will develop their ability to listen to a French spoken order.

RE

Throughout the first half of this term our topic is all about special places and the different special places there are across different religions. After half term, on the run up to Easter, we will be focusing on Christianity, looking at the Easter story and the words of Jesus.

Music

We will focus on Song this term and will understand how to add accompaniments. The children will start to sing with some awareness of other parts and performers.



PSHE

Our first topic in PSHE is 'Dreams and Goals' - understanding how to face new challenges and tackle obstacles.

We will then move onto the Healthy Me topic after half term.
