

## **Remote education provision: information for parents**

This information is intended to provide clarity and transparency to pupils and parents or carers about what to expect from remote education during this latest National Lockdown.

### **The remote curriculum: what is taught to pupils at home**

Following the first few days of remote education, will my child be taught broadly the same curriculum as they would if they were in school?

We aim to teach the same curriculum remotely as we do in school wherever possible and appropriate. However, we will need to make some adaptations in some subjects. For example, in maths where children do not have the concrete resources available at home, activities may be adapted.

### **Remote teaching and study time each day**

How long can I expect work set by the school to take my child each day?

Your child will receive approximately 3 hours of learning a day.

There will be a teacher led lesson at 9am every morning via TEAMS for half an hour. From this, a follow up activity will be set (approx. 30mins). This will be literacy on Monday and Wednesday and Mathematics on Tuesday and Thursday.

On the alternate days, literacy and maths will be set in the daily folders (this activity should take approximately 45mins).

On Friday at 9am, we will have a shared story time with all of the Class 2 children.

Learning for foundation subjects will be provided in daily folders in your class's TEAMS folder (this should take approximately 45mins).

Please ensure your child also reads for and practices their handwriting daily (this should take about 30mins).

### **Accessing remote education**

How will my child access any online remote education you are providing?

You can access your child's remote learning via their folder in TEAMS. Work for each day will be provided in a clearly labelled folder.

If my child does not have digital or online access at home, how will you support them to access remote education?

We recognise that some pupils may not have suitable online access at home. If this is the case, please contact Mrs Badham so she can discuss with you whether it is appropriate for the school to lend you a laptop or iPad.

If lending a laptop or iPad is not appropriate the school will facilitate printing the work for

the child and arrange for collection or delivery – dependent on circumstances. This is likely to be for 2 days work at a time. When new work is delivered/collected, the previous work can be returned.

How will my child be taught remotely?

We use a combination of the following approaches to teach pupils remotely:

- joining the children for teacher led learning every morning at 9am
- recorded teaching – these may be lessons recorded by Oak National Academy or video recordings created by myself.
- Websites with individual accounts
- PowerPoint presentations
- printed paper packs produced by teachers (e.g. workbooks, worksheets)
- reading books to change fortnightly – further information to be given.
- commercially available websites supporting the teaching of specific subjects or areas, including video clips or sequences

## **Engagement and feedback**

What are your expectations for my child's engagement and the support that we as parents and carers should provide at home?

- Children should complete all tasks given to them in the time requested
- Children should make themselves available for the live lessons
- Parents should monitor the child's work to ensure it is of high quality

How will you check whether my child is engaging with their work and how will I be informed if there are concerns?

- Online learning will be checked or marked regularly.
- Through children attending live lessons

If I have any concerns I will telephone you.

How will you assess my child's work and progress?

- Learning completed on paper can be emailed to the Class 2 email and a comment will be returned.
- Most electronic learning (e.g. Purple Mash, Mathletics etc.) will be checked and marked regularly

## **Additional support for pupils with particular needs**

How will you work with me to help my child who needs additional support from adults at home to access remote education?

Work will be differentiated to meet the needs of individuals requiring additional support.
