

English

Narrative – Through a selection of stories Class 2 will develop reading and writing skills including sentence structure, spellings, handwriting and punctuation. They will use the book *That Rabbit Belongs to Emily Brown* as inspiration.

Non-fiction – Class 2 will be writing a recount and exploring a book about Bats and the book *Ten Reasons to Love Turtles*.

Poetry – Class 2 will develop an understanding and love of poetry through Acrostic poetry, *Pirate Pete*, and *What We Found at the Sea*.

DT

Class 2 will be exploring moving pictures. They will explore levers and design and make their own. The children will be developing joining techniques and learn to measure and cut accurately.

Art

Class 2 will explore seascapes as a topic for exploring collage. They will work with a variety of art medium. The children will also explore weaving, using paper, material and natural objects.

History

Class 2 will learn about the Seaside in the Past, looking at how resorts have changed with an emphasis on the experiences of grandparents and their first-hand experiences.

Physical Education

Locomotion/Athletics – Class 2 will develop and refine their understanding of running and jumping, using different body parts in different ways. They will choose techniques without bumping into others, and apply this to games.

Ball Skills Hands – The children will develop underarm and overarm throwing at targets and to peers, and apply this to competitions, individually and in a team. They will develop and apply understanding of how to stop a ball.

Maths

Class 2 will be developing their skills and their vocabulary in a number of mathematical areas. The main focus will be on dividing and multiplying where the children will also count in 2s, 10s, 5s and 3s. They will use a variety of resources, part-whole models and diagrams to support their learning.

The children will also develop our understanding and skills for money and fractions.

Science

Class 2 will explore the features of the seasons, with a focus at the beginning of the term on Spring and moving on to the changes that happen during Summer. They will also explore changes that occur as animals and plants develop, including people, egg to owl, spawn to frog and acorn to oak.

Geography

The topic this term is habitats around the world. The children will learn about how different animals have individual needs through physical geography. This includes a focus on penguins, sharks, pandas and elephants and the environments they inhabit.

Computing

Class 2 will learn how to program and direct a variety of avatars and robots. They will become more confident coding and using the language of coding.

French – En Famillie

Class 2 will recap their numbers 1- 100, focussing more on numbers between 20 - 100. They will be able to tell you the words for family members in French, and with support, tell you what relation they are to them, how old they are and what they are called.

RE

The children will learn about Buddhism. They will focus on beliefs, rituals, celebrations and worship.

They will then explore stories from some religious texts including the Christianity, Islam, Judaism, Buddhism and Hinduism.

Music

Class 2 will be listening to and responding creatively to 'Carnival of the Animals' by Saint-Saens while learning about how music can be used descriptively.
